Beaches & Outdoor Recreation

Miller Place features access to approximately two miles of shoreline along the Long Island Sound, offering opportunities for waterfront enjoyment and outdoor recreation.

Nearby highlights include:

Cedar Beach – popular for swimming, fishing, and seasonal events

Cordwood Landing County Park – wooded trails leading to scenic water views

Local parks, bike paths, and nature preserves throughout the surrounding North Shore communities

Residents enjoy a variety of dining options ranging from casual eateries to local favorites and nearby waterfront restaurants. The neighboring village of Port Jefferson—just minutes away—offers a vibrant downtown with boutiques, cafés, and seasonal events.

Schools & Higher Education

The area is served by the Miller Place Union Free School District, which provides elementary through high school education within the community.

Stony Brook University – a major regional university offering academic, cultural, and medical resources

Transportation & Accessibility

Miller Place offers convenient access to major roadways and regional transportation options:

Nearby Long Island Rail Road stations in Port Jefferson and Ronkonkoma provide service to New York City

Access to major routes including Route 25A and the Long Island Expressway

Approximately 10–15 miles to Long Island MacArthur Airport
